












### Cross Country

### National Poetry Day

National Poetry Day was held on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> October this year and at Birtley East we were part of a very exciting opportunity. The children were invited to take part in a live lesson led by poet Laura Mucha, who was attempting to break a Guiness World Record for the largest multi-venue live lesson. The children were counted into the hall and had the chance to be part of creating a poem based on this year's theme of 'Counting'. The children shared some of their own ideas and voted through a poll to help edit and create the final poem. The Guiness World Record adjudicators will now gather all of the data from the participating schools and reveal whether we have been part of a Guiness World Record, but we will have to wait until next week for confirmation. Hopefully, upon our return to school next week we will officially be World Record holders!

To follow on from the live lesson yesterday Mrs Small has set the children a challenge to create a poem of their own based on the theme of counting. Counting can mean things that you like to count, things or people you count on or things that count in life. The poems can be serious, humorous, long or short, they may or may not rhyme. Every child that creates a poem of their own will receive house points and there will be some prizes for the best poems.
